

But most of all he was an adventurer and a photographer. The descriptions are from the Norwegian Coast, Greenland and mainly from the West Ice. He treasured his experiences in the Arctic sea fully and to its limits. The last record in the book, "Loss", is a novel built upon his adventures at the West Ice. He took the photographs, during his trips, with his Leica-camera.

The last pages in the book are some graphic reports, at the end of his life, with a reduced capacity to write with a pen, but still with the Arctic sea in him.

Photographer, painter, sculptor and video artist, Eleni Mylonas, draws her inspiration from helmets worn by protestors during the Arab Spring. Hats made of household objects and garbage, constitute her commentary on the daring and imagination of the protesters.

The title of the exhibition is drawn from a work by composer Manos Hadjidakis, who refers to the victory of Megalexandros (folk hero whose character holds allusions to Alexander the Great) against the terrible serpent that terrorized the country, with the intervention of Karaghiozis (hero of traditional shadow puppetry in Greece). Her works, highlight the fact that whatever crisis, whether external or personal, it may be vanquished with daring and imagination.

The "Correspondence 2007–2011" is the discourse, the exchange of thoughts with pictures, between Kyrillos Sarris and George Hadjimichalis.

The images therein, are drawn forth from remembrances, everyday life and the history of art. The binding principle of this correspondence was to not discuss the contents of a reply prior to sending a response. The gaps, the evocations and the digressions of this dialogue in letter form, uplift the images from their state of inertia and, with the new significance they acquire as "correspondence texts", form them into a single and cohesive work of art, which, as such, becomes public domain.

The correspondence, which follows the typical course of writing letters (envelope, postage-stamp, mailbox), began in January 2007 and ended in November 2011. Part of it (167 letters) was exhibited in April 2010 at the Institute of Contemporary Greek Art (iset).

The book "Works and Days of Hands" was issued on the occasion of Savvas Christodoulides' participation in the 30th Biennial of Sao Paulo. It contains twenty artworks chosen for this event by the curator of the Biennale, Luis Perez Oramas. The works not only comply with the theme of the Biennial, The "Imminence of Poetics", but are also leading examples of the artist's work: readymade items discard their state of expediency to become components in the artwork, thereby conforming to new ideological principles and values.

The title of the publication is taken from a verse by T. S. Eliot wherein works and days, that is to say, time, are considered as obeying and being subject to the body. In other words, the work – and the instance of its creation – is the fruit of a gesture made by the body and, in consequence, of the mind.

Kerameikos

"On my many trips to Athens I would go to Kerameikos, the ancient cemetery of Athens, when I needed some space from the busy metropolis for some rest and contemplation. What was it about this special place that drew me there time after time? Being a minimalist sculptor, the basic 3-dimensional forms lying on the grounds of the Kerameikos immediately caught my eye. I did not view these stone boxes, that generated so much mysterious energy as archeological artifacts as much as abstract minimalist forms, yet again there was a human element associated with them. I was enthralled with the arbitrary positions that had evolved over the centuries. They all stood out as individual objects working together to create one great sitespecific work. I asked myself, was there a process by which I could record this as my eye saw it and my psyche absorbed it? With my square-formatted Hasselblad camera, I photographed what I observed in two different visits. The twenty-one black and white silver gelatin prints are the final result."

Ioanna Ralli Still Life

"Still life objects are overlooked precisely because they belong to the realm of the ordinary world and therefore are not monumental. A vase, a flower, a lemon, a musical instrument, a bowl, a piece of material, are objects that are found in the home, a traditionally feminine space. In some way, every artist talks about himself. I gradually became aware of the fact that I was photographing objects that I have been living with for a very long time and had never really looked at, until now. I wonder how often this happens on a symbolic level. Many things are in front of my eyes that I don't see until I am ready. I prefer the term 'Still Life' used in English rather than 'Nature Morte' in French and 'Νεκρή Φύση' in Greek, One talks about life the other about death."

The series "Freud on Holiday" deals with the artist's particular relation to the work of Sigmund Freud ("Freud Dreams of Rome", vol.1, 2006 / "A Disturbance of Memory", vol.II, 2007 / "The Forgetting of a Proper Name", vol.III). This third volume describes a number of holiday possibilities. the problem of time and place, of cost and convenience, of appropriate companions and correct context. There are descriptions of train itineraries, of hotel rooms and restaurant menus, but a name resists recall for most of the book. There is a surprising connection with hysteria and another name is forgotten en route, accompanied by an embarrassing error in chronology. At last, forgotten names are remembered, although an image that has been talked away is not seen again.

Lizzie Calligas **Metoikesis**


